The Directorate of Distance Education was started w.e.f. the session 1997. To begin with MMC, BMC and REA courses were launched from the session 1998-99. The actual income of the Directorate during this year was Rs.38,80,681/-. The estimated receipts for the 1999-2000 were Rs.54,98,000/- and it WILES year Rs.80,00,000/- lacs for the year 2000-2001. The above estimates were placed before the Finance Committee in its meeting held on 23.3.3000 which made following recommendations vida resolution No.3(111) :-

The above recommendations of the Finance committee were approved by the Executive Council vide Resolution No.19 of its meeting held on 27.3.2000. In view of the above decision of the Executive Council the Directorate started two new courses nancly P.G.D.C.A. and M.Sc. (Computer Science) w.e.f. the session 2000-2001. As a result of introduction of these courses the total income/receipt during the year 2000-2001 has reached Rs.2,17,64,235/- (audited).

There is no sanctioned post for the Directorate of Distance Education. Therefore, shelpton staff from Nother branches has been posted in the Directorate of Distance Education to carry out the work of these courses. Besides, four superannuated personnels have been engaged on contractual basis @ Es.5000/- per month in order to meet the increased workload.

From the seasion 2001-2002, three new courses namely; Master in Insurance Business (MIB), Post Graduate Diploma in Taxation (PGDT) and Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Management (PGDFM) have introduced. In addition, four new courses vis. Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA), Post-Graduate Diploma in e-Commerce Technology (PGD-e-Con), Advanced Diploma in Web Programming (ADMP) and Diplome in Computing (DIC) have been launched in collaboration with Aptech Limited, Mambai. increased the workload has been Consequently, Also the Birectorate proposes to start nanyfold. three new course i.e. MEA, MCA and P.G. Diploma in Web Content Development and Cyber Journalism from the most session i.e. 2002-2003 which will further add the workload. In view of this, the posts referred to above are required to be created to carry on the work effectively and smoothly. The total annual approximate limbilities on account of creation of the amouthly. The total annual aforesaid posts will be to the tune of Rs. 27, 27, 200/-. a note containing the justification for creation of the aforesaid posts and showing the actual receipts of the Directorate for the year 2000-2001 is at Annexure-XXVIII Pages 48-52.

As mandated by the Regulations, online applications were submitted by the Entitled HEIs willing to offer programmes under online mode. Further, each HEI submitted affidavit for ensuring compliance to all the provisions of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020 and its amendments and also deposited prescribed fee as notified by the Commission.

The duly certified information submitted by the HEI, was to ascertain conformity to the following four provisions only:







The Republic of India as follows:-

- (1) This Act may be called Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar Act, 1995.

Definitions.

- 2. In this Act and in all the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made there under, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (a) "College" means a college maintained by, or admitted to the privileges of, the University under this Act;
 - (b) "employee" means any person appointed by the University, and includes teachers and all other staff of the University;
 - (c) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana;
 - (d) "institution" means an academic institution, not being a college, maintained by, or admitted to the privileges of the University;

Short title and commencement.

"University teachers" mean professors, (i) readers, lecturers and such other persons as may be appointed for imparting instructions or conducting research in the University or in any college or institution maintained by the University and are designated as teachers by the Ordinances.

There shall continue to be a body corporate by the 3.1 name of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology comprising of the Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellor of the University, and the members of the Court, the Executive Council and the Academic Council and all persons who may hereafter become or be appointed as such officers or members, so long as they continue to hold such office or membership.

The University shall have perpetual succession and a common seal with power to acquire, hold and dispose of property and to contract, and may by the said name sue or be sued.

*[4, (1) The limits of the area within which the University shall exercise its powers, shall be such as the Government may, from time to time, by notification, ** specify:

Provided that different areas may be specified for different faculties.

Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law (2)for the time being in force, any college situated within the limits of the area specified under sub-section (1) shall, with effect from such date as may be notified in this behalf by the Government, be deemed to be associated with, and admitted to, the privileges of the University and shall cease to be associated in any way with, or be admitted to, the privileges of any other University, and different dates may be notified for different colleges:

Provided that -

any student of any college, institute or Post Graduate (i) Regional Centre, Sirsa, associated with, or admitted to, the other University before the said date, who was studying for any degree or diploma examination of that University shall be permitted to complete his



Sub: Proposal to start Master of Arts (English) PG programme through Online Mode at CDOE, GJUS&T, Hisar.

It is submitted that Centre for Distance and Online Education is already running Master of Arts (English) PG programme through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode w.e.f. 2022-23 session. The CDOE, GJUS&T want to run Master of Arts (English) PG programme through Online mode as per growing demand of students from the PG programme through Online mode as per growing July-August, 2025 and onwards.

In this regard, as per UGC Regulation 2020, Clause-3(a), sub paragraph (B) & Clause-4 (ii) sub paragraph (C) of Part-II which are reproduced as under:

3.B (a) Higher Educational Institutions having NAAC score 3.26 and above or having rank in Top-100 in University category of National Institutional Ranking Framework, at least twice in three preceding cycles (at the time of application), shall be permitted to start full-fledged Online programmes without prior approval of the UGC, provided it satisfies all the conditions mentioned in these regulations:

Provided that the Higher Educational Institutions can start maximum of three (03) Under Graduate (UG) programmes and ten (10) Post Graduate (PG) programmes with the approval of its statutory authorities and in strict compliance with the provisions of these regulations:

Provided further that the NAAC and NIRF Ranking requirements shall be valid for academic session 2020-2021 (session beginning July, 2020 and January, 2021) only and shall be reviewed subsequently by the Commission for the academic session 2021-2022 (session beginning July 2021) and onwards:

Provided also that Higher Educational Institutions shall be required to submit application and desired information, and comply to all the provisions of the regulations and shall be required to submit an affidavit to the UGC:

4.C(ii) A Higher Educational Institution, shall be eligible to offer only those degree programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate levels and post graduate diploma programmes, which it has already been offering in conventional mode of classroom teaching or in Open and Distance Learning mode and from which at least one batch has passed out:

Provided that any programme requiring practical or laboratory course as a curricular requirement, shall be prohibited through Online mode, except in cases where practical component is limited to programming and coding including software tools.

In this connection, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020 clause mentioned above, CDOE, GJUS&T is eligible to start 03 Under Graduate (UG) and 10 Post Graduate (PG) programmes without prior approval of UGC as we have 3.38 NAAC score and the above mentioned Programme has already been running through Conventional mode and also more than one batch has been passed out.

Further, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020, Annexure-IV, One Programme Coordinator, One Course Coordinator and One Mentor are required to be appointed to start the Master of Arts (English) programme through Online mode. In this regard, clause-1(iii) of sub paragraph (B) of paragraph I is reproduced as under: -

- The involvement of permanent and/or full time dedicated faculty of Schools of Studies/Departments in the Online programme(s) shall be in the following capacities, excluding the designated positions in the Open Universities as per their respective Act(s):
 - a) Programme Coordinator (One per Programme): A full-time Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Programme shall be the Programme Coordinator for an Online Programme. The Programme Coordinator shall be responsible for over all coordination of the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in an Online Programme;

b) Course Coordinator (One per Course): An Online Programme may have more than one Course. In such a case, one full-time dedicated Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Course shall be Course Coordinator for each of the Courses of an Online Programme. The Course Coordinator shall coordinate the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in the Course;

Course Mentor (One per batch of 250 learners): Course Mentor shall assist the Programme/Course Coordinator in providing academic support to learners and also in managing virtual teacher-learner interaction groups. Course Mentor shall have the relevant qualifications and experience as specified for Assistant Professor under the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in the Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018;

In view of above, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor may kindly be requested for the following:-

DURATION OF PROGRAMME

The duration of the M.A English Programme is two years and the maximum duration is four years.

- 1. A student who for whatever reasons is not able to complete the programme within the normal period or the minimum duration prescribed for the programming shall be allowed two years period beyond the normal period to clear the backlog to be qualified for the degree. The general formula, therefore, will be as follows:
 - a) Time span = N+2 years for the completion of programme. Where N stands for the normal or minimum duration prescribed for completion of the programme.
 - b) In exceptional circumstances a further extension of one more year may be granted. The exceptional circumstances are spelt out clearly by the relevant statutory body of the University.
 - c) During the extended period, the student shall be considered as a private candidate and also not be eligible for ranking.
- 2. Ordinarily, no student will be given time beyond the extended period of two years. However, in exceptional circumstances and on the basis of the merits of each case, University may allow a student one more year for completion of the programme.
- 3. Further, the mercy chance, if any will be given within maximum allowed period of the programme as per UGC guidelines. In normal circumstances, only two chances will be given to pass re-appear examination.

FACULTY AND SUPPORT STAFF

FACULTY

The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) have qualified teaching faculty to look after the programme as a programme coordinator. They look for the following activities related to the distance education:

- > Conducting doubt classes for the distance students.
- Preparing E-content and E-Tutorial
- Operating LMS portal for student support activities
- Assisting in the change of Regulations and Curriculum, admission work, counseling new students and other issues such as break of study, exemptions etc.

SUPPORT STAFF

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The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of the university is headed by the director who is a full time faculty member (Professor) of the university appointed by Vice-Chancellor to facilitate the development, implementation and monitoring the programmes offered at CDOE and to attend all administrative matters concerned with the activities of directorate. The supporting staffs such as one Deputy Registrar, one Assistant Director, one Superintendent, two Deputy Superintendent, one Hindi Officer, Six Assistants and other clerical staff are coordinating the activities of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) and looks after the problems of the students. The Supporting staff looks after the problems of the students through on line admission help line, examination related work, study material delivery, grievance redressal and so on. The CDOE has LMS portal for the online programmes, providing access to the students to E-content and E-tutorial section, online uploading and evaluation of assignments, conduct of end semester exams and other student support activities. The CDOE also assisted by Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Computer and Informatics Centre (PDUCIC) department for communicating important information to the distance student through Distance website of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Hisar. The PDUCIC department managed the Distance Website of the University. There are four faculties of commerce in Centre for Distance and Online Education who are looking after the programme as programme coordinator and course co-ordinator. Further, support from faculties of parent teaching department i.e. Haryana School of Business (HSB) is taken during development of E-content and E-tutorial, doubt classes, preparation and evaluation of assignments and end term examination.

INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY MECHANISM

The Instructional delivery mechanisms of the University for online courses comprise of four components, viz, E-Content, E-Tutorial, Internal Assignments and End Term Examination.

a) E-Content: The success and effectiveness of an online distance education system hinge on the quality and design of its e-content. By focusing on creating PPT's that is comprehensive, engaging, and aligned with UGC guidelines, educators can significantly enhance the online

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learning experience. Incorporating a mix of textual, multimedia, and interactive resources not only caters to various learning preferences but also promotes a deeper understanding of the subject matter, making education more accessible and effective for a diverse student population.

- b) E-Tutorial: E-tutorials as an integral part of an online distance education system. E-tutorials, which include video-audio lectures, PowerPoint presentations (PPTs), and open-source materials, serve as a dynamic component of e-learning, offering in-depth insights into subject matters. The overall structure and content delivery strategy of the e-tutorials are designed to enhance learning outcomes by providing a detailed, engaging, and accessible learning experience. The specification that a five-credit course should have 30 hours of video content provides a clear standard for course development. It shall be the responsibility of the programme coordinator to ensure that none of the graphics, animation, images, sound clips, video clips used are plagiarized or cited without formal permission from owners.
- c) Discussion Forum: The facility of discussion forum also provided for raising of doubts and clarifying the same on real time basis for M.A English, programme by the respective Programme Coordinator and his/her team. The learners get their doubts cleared with the help of subject experts so as to improve their self-learning capability. Learners are required to attend e tutorial as well as discussion forum sessions for all their respective subjects. The mentor shall be the subject matter expert adept in handling technology. The Programme coordinator and mentor shall need to participate actively in discussion forum. Apart from discussion forum other interactive platforms like web conferencing may also be used.

d) Assessment:

❖ Internal Assessments: Distance education learners have to depend much on self-study. In order to ascertain the writing skill and level of comprehension of the learner, assignment work is compulsory for all learners. The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of this university has an online portal for the uploading of the assignments and same has been evaluated online by the subject expert. Two assignments of 30 marks i.e. 15 marks each is allotted for each subject consists of questions with practical based. The assignment question papers are uploaded on the website within a scheduled time and the learners are required to respond them within a specified period of time. The response of the learner is examined by a faculty member.



❖ External Assessment: At the end of every session learner will give theory examination that will be of 70 marks for each subject. For online mode examination, either using computer based test or pen and paper test in a proctored environment in designated test center with all the security arrangements ensuring transparency and credibility of the examinations. Online examination may also be conducted through technology mediated proctoring. The mode of question paper may include multiple choice questions (MCQs), fill in the blanks, matching questions, short answer type questions, long answer type questions, and quizzes.

• STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

The distance department of the university is provides the Student Support Services through online mode. Following are the main student support services provided by university through online mode:

- > Online LMS portal facilities available for admission, fee, assignments, examination and doubt classes for students
- > SMS alert facility for the students for information related to doubt classes, Project, Deadlines and Viva-voce etc.
- > Grievance handling mechanism is adopted with the help of supporting technical staff
- Practical Questions Based Assignments
- > On-line availability of Old Question Papers and study material
- > Comprehensive viva-voce is conducted after end term examination

Laboratory Support:

A well-equipped Computer lab with latest version of MS Office and internet facility is also available in the department of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of this university. This Computer Lab is established with an aim to meet the computing requirements of all the Distance learners of the University. MASTER OF ARTS (HINDI)

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Sub: Proposal to start Master of Arts (Hindi) PG programme through Online Mode at CDOE, GJUS&T, Hisar.

It is submitted that Centre for Distance and Online Education is already running Master of Arts (Hindi) PG programme through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode w.e.f. 2022-23 session. The CDOE, GJUS&T want to run Master of Arts (Hindi) PG programme through Online mode as per growing demand of students from the academic year 2025-26, academic session beginning July-August, 2025 and onwards.

In this regard, as per UGC Regulation 2020, Clause-3(a), sub paragraph (B) & Clause-4 (ii) sub paragraph (C) of Part-II which are reproduced as under: -

3.B (a) Higher Educational Institutions having NAAC score 3.26 and above or having rank in Top-100 in University category of National Institutional Ranking Framework, at least twice in three preceding cycles (at the time of application), shall be permitted to start full-fledged Online programmes without prior approval of the UGC, provided it satisfies all the conditions mentioned in these regulations:

Provided that the Higher Educational Institutions can start maximum of three (03) Under Graduate (UG) programmes and ten (10) Post Graduate (PG) programmes with the approval of its statutory authorities and in strict compliance with the provisions of these regulations:

Provided further that the NAAC and NIRF Ranking requirements shall be valid for academic session 2020-2021 (session beginning July, 2020 and January, 2021) only and shall be reviewed subsequently by the Commission for the academic session 2021-2022 (session beginning July 2021) and onwards:

Provided also that Higher Educational Institutions shall be required to submit application and desired information, and comply to all the provisions of the regulations and shall be required to submit an affidavit to the UGC:

4.C(ii) A Higher Educational Institution, shall be eligible to offer only those degree programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate levels and post graduate diploma programmes, which it has already been offering in conventional mode of classroom teaching or in Open and Distance Learning mode and from which at least one batch has passed out:

Provided that any programme requiring practical or laboratory course as a curricular requirement, shall be prohibited through Online mode, except in cases where practical component is limited to programming and coding including software tools.

In this connection, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020 clause mentioned above, CDOE, GJUS&T is eligible to start 03 Under Graduate (UG) and 10 Post Graduate (PG) programmes without prior approval of UGC as we have 3.38 NAAC score and the above mentioned Programme has already been running through Conventional mode and also more than one batch has been passed out.

Further, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020, Annexure-IV, One Programme Coordinator, One Course Coordinator and One Mentor are required to be appointed to start the Master of Arts (Hindi) programme through Online mode. In this regard, clause-1(iii) of sub paragraph (B) of paragraph I is reproduced as under: -

- iii) The involvement of permanent and/or full time dedicated faculty of Schools of Studies/Departments in the Online programme(s) shall be in the following capacities, excluding the designated positions in the Open Universities as per their respective Act(s):
 - a) Programme Coordinator (One per Programme): A full-time Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Programme shall be the Programme Coordinator for an Online Programme. The Programme Coordinator shall be responsible for over all coordination of the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in an Online Programme;

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- b) Course Coordinator (One per Course): An Online Programme may have more than one Course. In such a case, one full-time dedicated Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Course shall be Course Coordinator for each of the Courses of an Online Programme. The Course Coordinator shall coordinate the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in the Course;
- c) Course Mentor (One per batch of 250 learners): Course Mentor shall assist the Programme/Course Coordinator in providing academic support to learners and also in managing virtual teacher-learner interaction groups. Course Mentor shall have the relevant qualifications and experience as specified for Assistant Professor under the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in the Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018;

In view of above, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor may kindly be requested for the following:-

- (i) To approve the proposal to start Master of Arts (Hindi) PG programme through Online mode in Centre for Distance & Online Education, GJUS&T, Hisar w.e.f. academic year 2025-26, academic session beginning July-August, 2025 and onwards U/S 11(5) in anticipation of approval of Academic Council and Executive Council of the University Act, 1995.
- (ii) To appoint Programme Coordinator and Course Coordinator for the Master of Arts (Hindi) Online PG programme to oversee the timely development of the LMS, coordinate faculty efforts, and ensure smooth programme implementation.

> लक्ष्य समूह की संरचना

- शिक्षा प्राप्त करने की एक निर्धारित उम्र बीत जाने के बाद जो अपनी शिक्षा जारी रखना चाहते हैं वे लाभ प्राप्त कर सकते हैं।

- एम.ए. हिंदी कार्यक्रम विश्वविद्यालय के विशेष स्नातकोत्तर पाठ्यक्रमों में से एक है।
- यह प्रोग्राम साहित्य का अध्ययन करने की अनुमित देता है।
- यह प्रोग्राम स्नातकोत्तर के बाद आगे पीएच. डी करने के लिए प्रोत्साहित करता है।
- यह प्रोग्राम विद्यार्थियों को सामाजिक दायित्वों के प्रति जागरूक करते हुए लोक कल्याणकारी कार्यों को करने के लिए प्रोत्साहित करता है।

5. पाठ्यक्रम योजना (सिलेबस डिजाइन)

सभी की आवश्यकताओं को ध्यान में रखते हुए इस प्रोग्राम की पाठ्यक्रम योजना तैयार की गई है। विभागीय समिति द्वारा पाठ्यक्रम का डिजाइन और मूल्यांकन किया जाता है। इसके बाद पाठ्यक्रम को बोर्ड ऑफ स्टडीज में रखा जाता है। अंतिम रूप से पाठ्यक्रम को अंतिम अनुमोदन के लिए अकादिमक परिषद में रखा जाता है। दूरस्थ शिक्षा का विशेष निकाय सुनिश्चित करता है कि दूरस्थ शिक्षा पाठ्यक्रम में नियमित कार्यक्रमों के समान पाठ्यक्रम हो। हालांकि जब भी मौजूदा पाठ्यक्रम में संशोधन / परिवर्धन किए जाते हैं तो अध्ययन बोर्ड और अकादिमक परिषद का अनुमोदन प्राप्त किया जाता है। कार्यक्रम को वार्षिक प्रणाली (सेमेस्टर) मोड में डिजाइन किया गया है।

> पाठ्यक्रम प्रारूप

यह मात्र अध्ययन का एक पाठ्यक्रम नहीं है। इसका व्यापक उद्देश्य छात्रों को भाषा और साहित्य से जोड़ना भी है। इसके अन्य उद्देश्यों में शिक्षार्थियों को ओडीएल और ऑनलाइन वातावरण, अनुभव शिक्षकों और शिक्षण एवं अधिगम की प्रक्रियाओं के साथ नवीन प्रयोग करने और वास्तविक संदर्भों में साहित्य और भाषा के महत्व को एकीकृत करने के कई अवसर प्रदान करता है। रचनात्मक अनुभव सुनिश्चित करने के लिए मूल्यांकन प्रक्रिया भी

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व्यापक और निरंतर होनी चाहिए जिसमें मात्रात्मक और गुणात्मक दोनों पैरामीटर शामिल होने हैं। निर्देशात्मक डिजाइन में प्रिंट ऑडियो या वीडियो, ऑडियो विजुअल और ऑनलाइन कंप्यूटर एडेड सिस्टम शामिल हैं। नए दौर में यह विभिन्न तरीकों से छात्रों को सहायता प्रदान करता है। इसलिए वर्तमान में चल रहे एक उचित पाठ्यक्रम के साथ (सेमेस्टर—वार्षिक प्रणाली) को डिजाइन किया गया है। पाठ्यक्रम का शैक्षणिक सत्र (2025—2026) है। विश्वविद्यालय के दिशा—निर्देशों के अनुसार प्रत्येक वर्ष जुलाई से जून तक होगा। इसे नए बैच के साथ सेमेस्टर—रूप में प्रस्तुत किया जाएगा। इसलिए प्रस्तावित पाठ्यक्रम में चार सेमेस्टर हैं जो दो वर्षों में विभाजित हैं।

6. कार्यक्रम की संरचना :

किसी भी कार्यक्रम की संरचना छात्रों को विषयों के विभिन्न संयोजनों का अध्ययन करने का सुअवसर प्रदान करता है।

- अनिवार्य प्रश्नपत्र इस स्नातकोत्तर हिंदी पाठ्यक्रम में दो सालों के अंतर्गत प्रथम वर्ष के दो सेमेस्टर में एवं द्वितीय वर्ष के दो सेमेस्टर में चार—चार प्रश्नपत्र अनिवार्य है।
- वैकल्पिक प्रश्नपत्र इस स्नातकोत्तर हिंदी पाठ्यक्रम में दो सालों के अंतर्गत प्रथम वर्ष के दो सेमेस्टर में, द्वितीय वर्ष के दो सेमेस्टर में एक—एक वैकल्पिक प्रश्नपत्र है। विद्यार्थी अपनी रूचि के अनुसार किसी भी वैकल्पिक विषय का चुनाव कर सकता है।

7. विस्तृत पाठ्यक्रम :

विस्तृत योजना और पाठ्यक्रम नीचे दिए गए हैं और डीईबी, यूजीसी से अनुमोदन प्राप्त करने के बाद विश्वविद्यालय की वेबसाइट (www.gjust.ac.in) पर भी उपलब्ध होंगे और पाठ्यक्रम की अधिकांश सामग्री पारंपरिक माध्यम से भी प्रस्तुत होगी।

8. कार्यक्रम की अवधि

एमए. हिंदी की न्यूनतम अवधि दो वर्ष है और अधिकतम अवधि चार वर्ष है। यह कार्यक्रम वार्षिक प्रणाली को अपनाता है और उक्त कार्यक्रम को सत्र 2025—2026 के लिए च्वाइस आधारित क्रेडिट सिस्टम (सीबीसीएस) के अनुसार चलाया जाएगा जिसमें छात्र या ज्ञान चाहने वाले को वैकल्पिक तौर पर अपना पाठ्यक्रम चुनने की सुविधा होती है।

9. संकाय और सहयोगी कर्मचारी

इस कार्यक्रम को चलाने के लिए एक पूर्णकालिक संकाय नियुक्त किया जाता है। सहायक स्टाफ छात्रों की समस्याओं की देखभाल करता है। ऑनलाइन प्रवेश, हेल्पलाइन परीक्षा से संबंधित कार्य, अध्ययन सामग्री वितरण, शिकायत, निवारण आदि उनके कार्य दायित्व है। संकाय के अंतर्गत सभी पदों की भर्ती हमेशा यूजीसी के दिशा निर्देशों के अनुसार की जाती है।

विश्वविद्यालय के दूरस्थ एवं शिक्षा ऑनलाइन निदेशालय (सीडीओई) का नेतृत्व निदेशक द्वारा किया जाता है। जो सीडीओई में प्रस्तावित कार्यक्रमों के विकास, कार्यान्वयन

और निगरानी की सुविधा के लिए कुलपित द्वारा नियुक्त विश्वविद्यालय का पूर्णकालिक संकाय सदस्य (प्रोफेसर) होता है। निदेशालय की गतिविधियों से संबंधित सभी प्रशासनिक मामले उसकी देखरेख में संपंन किए जाते हैं। इसके अलावा, दूरस्थ एवं शिक्षा ऑनलाइन निदेशालय का एक पूर्णकालिक संकाय सदस्य के पद पर नियुक्त होता है। सहायक स्टाफ में डिप्टी रिजस्ट्रार, एक सहायक निदेशक, एक अधीक्षक और दो उप अधीक्षक, एक हिंदी अधिकारी, छह सहायक और अन्य लिपिक कर्मचारी शामिल हैं जो दूरस्थ एवं ऑनलाइन िक्षा निदे ॥लय (सीडीओई) की गतिविधियों का समन्वय कर रहे हैं और दूरस्थ छात्रों की समस्याओं को देखते हैं। सहायक कर्मचारी ऑनलाइन प्रवेश हेल्प लाइन, परीक्षा संबंधी कार्य, अध्ययन सामग्री वितरण, शिकायत निवारण आदि के माध्यम से छात्रों की समस्याओं को देखता है। डीडीई को असाइनमेंट और अन्य छात्र सहायता गतिविधियों के ऑनलाइन अपलोडिंग और मूल्यांकन के लिए आईटी सेल द्वारा सहायता ग्रदान की जाती है। डीडीई ने भी पं. दीनदयाल उपाध्याय कंप्यूटर एंड इंफॉर्मेटिक्स सेंटर (पीडीयूसीआईसी) विभाग, गुरु जम्मेश्वर विज्ञान और प्रौद्योगिकी विश्वविद्यालय, हिसार की दूरस्थ वेबसाइट के माध्यम से दूरस्थ छात्र को महत्वपूर्ण जानकारी संप्रेषित करने के लिए। PDUCIC विभाग विश्वविद्यालय की दूरस्थ वेबसाइट का प्रबंधन करता है।

10. संकाय :

दूरस्थ एवं ऑनलाइन शिक्षा निदेशालय (सीडीओई) के पास पाठ्यक्रम समन्वयक के रूप में कार्यक्रम को देखने के लिए योग्य शिक्षण संकाय हैं। वे दूरस्थ शिक्षा से संबंधित निम्नलिखित गतिविधियों को क्रियांवित करते है:

- दूरस्थ छात्रों के लिए व्यक्तिगत संपर्क कार्यक्रम (पीसीपी) कक्षाओं का आयोजन।
- विनियमों और पाठ्यचर्या में परिवर्तन, प्रवेश कार्य, नए छात्रों की काउंसलिंग करना।
- शैक्षणिक गतिविधियों को बनाए रखने के लिए सभी अध्ययन केंद्रों के साथ समन्वय करना।
- सभी सेमेस्टर / वर्ष के लिए अध्ययन सामग्री तैयार करने के लिए समन्वय करना।
- छात्रों के सत्रीय कार्य की तैयारी और मूल्यांकन और मौखिक परीक्षा के लिए संकाय सदस्यों के साथ समन्वय करना।

11. निर्देशात्मक वितरण तंत्र

ऑनलाइन पाठ्यक्रमों के लिए विश्वविद्यालय के निर्देशात्मक वितरण तंत्र में चार घटक शामिल हैं, अर्थात ई—सामग्री, ई—ट्यूटोरियल, आंतरिक असाइनमेंट और अंतिम अवधि परीक्षा।

- क) ई—सामग्री : एक ऑनलाइन दूरस्थ शिक्षा प्रणाली की सफलता और प्रभावशीलता इसकी ई—सामग्री की गुणवत्ता और डिजाइन पर टिकी है। एसएलएम बनाने पर ध्यान केंद्रित करके जो व्यापक है, आकर्षक है, और यूजीसी दिशानिर्देशों के साथ गठबंधन किया गया है, शिक्षक ऑनलाइन को काफी बढ़ा सकते हैं।
- ख) ई ट्यूटोरियल : ई-ट्यूटोरियल एक ऑनलाइन दुरस्थ शिक्षा प्रणाली का एक अभिन्न अंग है। ई-ट्यूटोरियल, जिसमें वीडियो-ऑडियो व्याख्यान, पावरपॉइंट प्रेजेंटेशन (पीपीटी) और ओपन-सोर्स सामग्री शामिल हैं, ई-लर्निंग के गतिशील घटक के रूप में कार्य करते हैं, जो विषय वस्तुओं में गहन अंतर्दृष्टि प्रदान करते हैं। ई–ट्यूटोरियल की समग्र संरचना और सामग्री वितरण रणनीति एक विस्तृत, आकर्षक और सूलभ सीखने का अनुभव प्रदान करके सीखने के परिणामों को बढ़ाने के लिए डिजाइन की गई है। विनिर्देश के अनुसार पांच-क्रेडिट कोर्स में 25 घंटे की वीडियो सामग्री होनी चाहिए, पाठ्यक्रम विकास के लिए एक स्पष्ट मानक प्रदान करता है। यह सुनिश्चित करना कार्यक्रम समन्वयक की जिम्मेदारी होगी कि उपयोग किए गए किसी भी ग्राफिक्स, एनीमेशन, चित्र, ध्वनि क्लिप, वीडियो विलप की नकल न की जाए या मालिकों की पूर्व अनुमित के बिना उद्धत न किया जाए। ग) चर्चा मंच : एम.ए. कार्यक्रम के लिए संबंधित कार्यक्रम समन्वयक और उनकी टीम द्वारा वास्तविक समय के आधार पर भांकाओं का समाधान करने और उन्हें स्पष्ट करने के लिए चर्चा मंच की सुविधा भी प्रदान की गई है। शिक्षार्थियों को विषय विशेषज्ञों की मदद से अपने संदेह दूर करने होते हैं ताकि उनकी स्क्यं सीखने की क्षमता में सूधार हो सके। शिक्षार्थियों को अपने सभी संबंधित विषयों के लिए ई ट्यूटोरियल के साथ-साथ चर्चा मंच सत्रों में भाग लेना आवश्यक है। मेंटर विषय वस्तु विशेषज्ञ होगा जो प्रौद्योगिकी को संभालने में निपुण होगा। कार्यक्रम समन्वयक और मेंटर को चर्चा मंच में सक्रिय रूप से भाग लेना होगा। चर्चा मंच के अलावा वेब कॉन्फ्रेंसिंग जैसे अन्य इंटरैक्टिव प्लेटफॉर्म का

भी उपयोग किया जा सकता है।

घ) मूल्यांकन

- आंतिरक मूल्यांकन— दूरस्थ शिक्षा शिक्षार्थियों को स्व—अध्ययन पर अधिक निर्भर रहना पड़ता है। शिक्षार्थी के लेखन कौशल और समझ के स्तर का पता लगाने के लिए, सभी शिक्षार्थियों के लिए सत्रीय कार्य अनिवार्य है। इस विश्वविद्यालय के दूरस्थ एवं ऑनलाइन िक्षा निदे ालय (सीडीओई) के पास असाइनमेंट अपलोड करने के लिए एक ऑनलाइन पोर्टल है और इसका मूल्यांकन विषय विशेषज्ञ द्वारा ऑनलाइन किया जाएगा। प्रत्येक विषय के लिए 20 अंकों के दो सत्रीय कार्य अर्थात 10 अंक प्रत्येक के लिए आवंटित किए जाएंगे जिनमें व्यावहारिक आधारित प्रश्न होंगे। सत्रीय कार्य के प्रश्न पत्र एक निर्धारित समय के भीतर वेबसाइट पर अपलोड कर दिए जाएंगे और शिक्षार्थियों को एक निश्चित अविध के भीतर उनका जवाब देना होगा। शिक्षार्थीं की प्रतिक्रिया की जांच एक संकाय सदस्य द्वारा की जाती है।
- अंतिम परीक्षाएं— प्रत्येक सत्र के अंत में शिक्षार्थी प्रत्येक विषय के लिए 80 अंकों की सैद्धांतिक परीक्षा देंगे, जो निर्धारित पाठ्यक्रम के आधार पर होगा।

It is submitted that Centre for Distance and Online Education is already running Master of Science (Mathematics) PG programme through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode w.e.f. 2022-23 session. The CDOE, GJUS&T want to run Master of Science (Mathematics) PG programme through Online mode as per growing demand of students from the academic year 2025-26, academic session beginning July-August, 2025 and onwards.

In this regard, as per UGC Regulation 2020, Clause-3(a), sub paragraph (B) & Clause-4 (ii) sub paragraph (C) of Part-II which are reproduced as under: -

3.B (a) Higher Educational Institutions having NAAC score 3.26 and above or having rank in Top-100 in University category of National Institutional Ranking Framework, at least twice in three preceding cycles (at the time of application), shall be permitted to start full-fledged Online programmes without prior approval of the UGC, provided it satisfies all the conditions mentioned in these regulations:

Provided that the Higher Educational Institutions can start maximum of three (03) Under Graduate (UG) programmes and ten (10) Post Graduate (PG) programmes with the approval of its statutory authorities and in strict compliance with the provisions of these regulations:

Provided further that the NAAC and NIRF Ranking requirements shall be valid for academic session 2020-2021 (session beginning July, 2020 and January, 2021) only and shall be reviewed subsequently by the Commission for the academic session 2021-2022 (session beginning July 2021) and onwards:

Provided also that Higher Educational Institutions shall be required to submit application and desired information, and comply to all the provisions of the regulations and shall be required to submit an affidavit to the UGC:

4.C(ii) A Higher Educational Institution, shall be eligible to offer only those degree programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate levels and post graduate diploma programmes, which it has already been offering in conventional mode of classroom teaching or in Open and Distance Learning mode and from which at least one batch has passed out:

Provided that any programme requiring practical or laboratory course as a curricular requirement, shall be prohibited through Online mode, except in cases where practical component is limited to programming and coding including software tools.

In this connection, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020 clause mentioned above, CDOE, GJUS&T is eligible to start 03 Under Graduate (UG) and 10 Post Graduate (PG) programmes without prior approval of UGC as we have 3.38 NAAC score and the above mentioned Programme has already been running through Conventional mode and also more than one batch has been passed out.

Further, it is submitted that as per UGC Regulation 2020, Annexure-IV, One Programme Coordinator, One Course Coordinator and One Mentor are required to be appointed to start the Master of Science (Mathematics) programme through Online mode. In this regard, clause-1(iii) of sub paragraph (B) of paragraph I is reproduced as under: -

- The involvement of permanent and/or full time dedicated faculty of Schools of Studies/Departments in the Online programme(s) shall be in the following capacities, excluding the designated positions in the Open Universities as per their respective Act(s):
 - a) Programme Coordinator (One per Programme): A full-time Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Programme shall be the Programme Coordinator for an Online Programme. The Programme Coordinator shall be responsible for over all coordination of the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in an Online Programme;

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- b) Course Coordinator (One per Course): An Online Programme may have more than one Course. In such a case, one full-time dedicated Faculty at the level of Professor or Associate Professor or Assistant Professor in the subject area of the concerned Course shall be Course Coordinator for each of the Courses of an Online Programme. The Course Coordinator shall coordinate the development, delivery and assessments of the learners in the Course;
- c) Course Mentor (One per batch of 250 learners): Course Mentor shall assist the Programme/Course Coordinator in providing academic support to learners and also in managing virtual teacher-learner interaction groups. Course Mentor shall have the relevant qualifications and experience as specified for Assistant Professor under the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in the Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2018;

NAME OF THE PROGRAMME: M.Sc. Mathematics

A. PROGRAMME'S MISSION & OBJECTIVES:

The mission of programme is to provide high quality education in pure and applied mathematics to prepare the students for higher studies or professional career in mathematical sciences and related fields. The programme of M.Sc. mathematics will be a source for the promotion for problem solving, analytical thinking and utilizing technology for societal advancement. The programme offers an exciting opportunity to students who are interested in mathematics and who wish to understand how mathematics can be put up to practical use in science, engineering, and technology.

The main objectives of the programme are:

- > To democratize higher education in mathematics by providing access to large segments of the population, in particular the disadvantaged groups such as those living in remote and rural areas, including working people, women and others who wish to acquire and upgrade their mathematical knowledge and skills.
- > To acquire knowledge about the nature, concepts, methods, techniques, and study of advanced fields of Algebra, Analysis, Geometry, Topology and Applied Mathematics, together with some historical perspective of their development.
- To develop an enhanced skill set that will put the learners at an advantage in careers in Mathematics, education, computer science, economics, engineering and finance etc.
- > To expose the learner to real life problems and promote the use of mathematics in industry and applied mathematics.
- > To train learners to learn in an autonomous manner and know how to tackle research in mathematical sciences.
- > To mitigate the need of qualified professionals having specialized knowledge in mathematics for better cognitive and socio-economic development of the country.

Mathematics will meet the learning aspiration of higher mathematics by providing "second chance" to those who had to discontinue their formal education or could not join regular Colleges or Universities owing to social, economic, and other unavoidable constraints. The M.Sc. Mathematics prepares the student with mathematical skill required.

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E. INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN:

At the state and national level, the higher educational institutions are expected to provide quality education and education for all. Strategic plans for an institution that defines targets and measures of the programmes are to be achieved by the institution. Apart from providing physical infrastructure and maintaining administrative policies, Centre for Distance and Online Education, is actively engaged in its academic development of course offered. The Department of Mathematics has designed its curriculum, several learning resource materials and feedback system through the Board of Studies. Learning Material through print media named E-content and E-tutorial via Self-Learning Material (SLM) has been developed with the approach of self-explanatory, self -contained and self-motivating as per UGC DEB guidelines. The personal programme classes are conducted in every semester on a specified schedule.

i) Curriculum design:

The programme of M.Sc. Mathematics (Online mode) is divided in to four semesters. The scheme and syllabi of M.Sc. mathematics at directorate level has been adopted from the P.G. course of regular students of Department of Mathematics. Further the examination for students the online mode is conducted along with M.Sc. Mathematics regular mode students. The curriculum is designed by Board of Studies in Mathematics where external experts are also associated.

The scheme and syllabus being followed is attached in annexure (A).

ii) Duration of Programme:

The duration of Post Graduate Mathematics programme is 2 years (Four Semesters).

- 1. As per UGC guidelines, the candidate is required to complete the degree in N+2 years, where N stands for the normal or minimum duration prescribed for completion of the programme.
 - a) In exceptional circumstances a further extension of one year may be granted by the statutory body of the University.
 - b) During the extended period, the student shall be considered as a private candidate and shall not be eligible for ranking.
- 2. Further, the mercy chance, if any will be given within maximum allowed period of the programme as per UGC guidelines. In normal circumstances, only two chances will be given to pass re -appear examination.

iii) Faculty and Support staff:

The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of the University is headed by the director who is a full time faculty member (Professor) of the University appointed by Vice-Chancellor to facilitate the development, implementation and monitoring the programmes offered at CDOE and to attend all administrative matters concerned with the activities of directorate. In addition, there is one full time faculty member of Centre for Distance and Online Education who is holding the position of Deputy Director. The supporting staff such as one Deputy Registrar, one Assistant

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Director, one Superintendent, two Deputy Superintendent, one Hindi Officer, Six Assistants and other clerical staff is coordinating the activities of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) and looks after the problems of the distance students. The Supporting staff looks after the problems of the students through online admission help line, examination related work, study material delivery, grievance redressal and so on. The CDOE is assisted by the IT CELL for the online uploading and evaluation of assignments and other student support activities. The CDOE also assisted by Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Computer and Informatics Centre (PDUCIC) department for communicating important information to the distance student through Distance website of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar. The PDUCIC department managed the Distance Website of the University.

There are two full time faculty members (dedicated to CDOE) to coordinate the M.Sc. Mathematics programme. The faculty members of Department of Mathematics including 4 Professors, 02 Associate Professor and 4 Assistant Professors help in academic part of programme. Further the faculty members of neighbouring Universities also extents their help for development of study material and evaluation of assignments. Also, the supporting staffs from Centre for Distance and Online Education help in performing administrative functioning. The Supporting staff looks after the problems of the students through on line admission help line, examination related work, study material delivery, grievance redressal and so on. The CDOE has LMS Portal for the online programmes, providing access to the students to E-Content and E-Tutorial section, uploading and evaluation of assignments, conduct of End-Semester Exams and other student support activities. The CDOE also assisted by Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Computer and Informatics Centre (PDUCIC) department for communicating important information to the distance student through Distance website of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Hisar. The PDUCIC department managed the Distance Website of the University. There are two faculties of management in Centre for Distance and Online Education who are looking after the programme as programme coordinator and course coordinator. Further, support from faculties of parent teaching department i.e. Haryana School of Business (HSB) is taken during development of E-Content and E-Tutorial, online doubt classes, preparation, and evaluation of assignments etc.

F. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSIONS, CURRICULUM TRANSACTION AND EVALUATION

• Procedure for Admissions

Admission Procedure - Whole admission process is online as per the University rules.

Admission policy for the programme - Admission is based on filling online Admission Form. The procedure of filling the online application form is a four-step procedure, i.e.

- > Candidate Registration.
- > Payment option through Net Banking, Debit card or Credit card.
- > Filling of application form.
- > Uploading required scanned documents.
- ➤ Generating Preview

Admission: Admissions process are made through online mode. Admission fee is also collected through online payment gateway service.

Eligibility: B.A.(Hons.)/B.Sc.(Hons.) in Mathematics with atleast 50% marks (pass marks for SC Candidates of Haryana)

Or

B.A./B.Sc. with atleast 50% marks in aggregate with Mathematics as one of the subjects in each Semester/ Year of B.A./B.Sc. degree (pass marks for SC candidates of Haryana) and University retains the right to cancel any admission at any given point of time if any irregularity is found in the admission process, eligibility etc.

In addition to above ₹ 100/- as Student Fee ship (Alumni Fund) is also payable once in course duration at time of admission.

Financial Assistance: The post metric scholarship facility is provided to SC students of Haryana.

Curriculum transaction: E-content and E-tutorials (English version) in print and electronic medium are provided as approved by the Board of Studies and Academic Council of the University. online doubt classes schedule for PG courses are prepared by program coordinator and notified well in advance on the official website of the University. SMS's of schedule are also sent to students on their registered mobile numbers/whatApp group. During the online doubt classes sessions, teachers help the students and clarify their queries.

Evaluation The evaluation system of the programme is based on following components: Continuous evaluation in the form of the assignments (weightage: 30%): The assignments are to be uploaded online by students on University portal. Term-end examination (weightage: 70%): Term-end exams are to be held every year in the month of December (odd semester) and May (ever semester) along with regular students of M.Sc. Mathematics.

Updated Notification for its Learners: All notification regarding all the academic activities to be carried out by the University during the academic session are provided on the official website and student's registered mobile number of the learners. Further, the University notify all notification, assignment question papers, result and other related online.

INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY MECHANISM

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The Instructional delivery mechanisms of the University for online courses comprise of four components, viz, E-Content, E-Tutorial, Internal Assignments and End Term Examination.

- a) E-Content— The success and effectiveness of online distance education systems largely depends on the E-content in the form of self-learning mode (E-content). So, it is necessary that the online study material must be ideal for easy and better understanding. Learning Material through electronic media named Self-learning Material (E-Content and E-Tutorial) is developed with the approach of self-explanatory, self-contained, self-motivating and self-evacuating followed by the UGC guidelines. Beside this, the E-content also may include e-book, illustrations, case studies, presentations and web resources such as further references, related links, open source content on internet, video, case studies, research papers, journals, anecdotal information, articles, historical development of the subject etc.
- b) E-Tutorial E-Tutorial in the form of video-audio lectures, PPTs, virtual labs etc., guide the learners for better insights on subject matters. It shall be the responsibility of the course coordinator to ensure that none of the graphics, animation, images, sound clips, video clips used are plagiarized or cited without formal permission from owners. The information for the e-tutorial is communicated to the learners through our website or SMS Services. During e-tutorial, the learner gets guidance for better insights of the subject. A five-credit course shall typically have 20 hours of video content and 20 hours of reading material.
- c) Discussion Forum: The facility of discussion forum also provided for raising of doubts and clarifying the same on real time basis for MBA. programme by the respective Course Coordinator and his/her team. The learners get their doubts cleared with the help of subject experts so as to improve their self-learning capability. Learners are required to attend e tutorial as well as discussion forum sessions for all their respective subjects. The mentor shall be the subject matter expert adept in handling technology. The course coordinator and mentor shall need to participate actively in discussion forum. Apart from discussion forum other interactive platforms like web conferencing may also be used.

ASSESSMENTS-

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- d) Internal Assessments- Distance education learners have to depend much on self-study. In order to ascertain the writing skill and level of comprehension of the learner, assignment work is compulsory for all learners. The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of this university has an online portal for the uploading of the assignments and same has been evaluated online by the subject expert. Two assignments of 30 marks i.e. 15 marks each is allotted for each subject consists of questions with practical based. The assignment question papers are uploaded on the website within a scheduled time and the learners are required to respond them within a specified period. The response of the learner is examined by a faculty member.
- examination that will be of 70 marks for each subject. For online mode examination, either using computer-based test or pen and paper test in a proctored environment in designated test center with all the security arrangements ensuring transparency and credibility of the examinations. Online examination may also be conducted through technology mediated proctoring. The mode of question paper may include multiple choice questions (MCQs), fill in the blanks, matching questions, short answer type questions, long answer type questions, and quizzes.

The distance department of the university is providing the Student Support Services through online mode. Following are the main student support services provided by university through online mode:

- ➤ Comprehensive viva-voce is conducted after term end examination in the University

G. REQUIREMENT OF THE LABORATORY SUPPORT AND LIBRARY RESOURCES

Laboratory Support:

A well-equipped Computer lab with latest version of MS Office and internet facility is also available in the department of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) of this university. This Computer Lab is established with an aim to meet the computing requirements of all the Distance learners of the University. This lab is equipped with 12 desktop computers of latest configuration i.e. Window 10 and I3 processor. In addition to this, there is one printer, one scanner and one LED in the Computer Lab for teaching through presentation and video lectures to students. There is one lab attendant for handling the queries regarding online admission, fee payment, uploading of assignments, any other queries through mail, etc.

Library Resources:

The infrastructure related to library resources is available in the present set-up of the university whereby, we have a well stacked library with latest books, journals, magazines and newspapers. It is named after the great Indian Jurist, Economist, Politician and Social Reformer Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. The seating capacity of the University Library is 400 seats. By the end of March 2023, the Library has a collection of 126032 books. The Library in its electronic repository has the access to 8000 + e-journals from 13 publishers and 5 Databases. Moreover, 2,82,203 e-books of national and international repute publishers have also been in e-repository to enrich the students. University library provides different services to distance learners such as Air Conditioned Reading Halls, Reading Facility for 400 students, Laptop Lab for SC/ST students consisting of 20 Laptops with internet facility and Potable Water facility on every floor. The online e-library resources namely INFLIBNET is also available for the accessibility of books and journals.
